INDIA

Hostility against followers of Jesus in India is often driven by an ongoing belief among militant Hindu nationalists that all Indians ought to be Hindu. This mindset has led to violent mob attacks across the country and impunity for the people who perpetrate this violence. More and more Indian states are also implementing anti-conversion laws, creating an environment where any Christian who shares their faith can be accused of a crime.

One ministering couple, Pastor Prem and his wife Amala, serve in an area where Christians are often forced to leave due to persecution. Pastor Prem has been beaten four times, faces constant pressure from the community, and is continually being watched. For his safety, he does not leave the house after 6 p.m. Still, as he and his wife love the people in their town, they have chosen to stay to share the Gospel with those in need of Christ.

CHINA

For unregistered congregations in China, increasing restrictions have led to the forceful closures of hundreds of churches, along with the arrests of numerous pastors and church members. Sometimes those detained are interrogated and released; others are confined for months without trial. It is also forbidden for children under 18 to attend church or receive religious teaching, even if they are taught by their own parents.

In the midst of these challenges, many imprisoned church leaders seize the ministry opportunities presented to them within the confines of their prison cells. One example of such dedication was demonstrated by Pastor Geng Zejun whose "congregation" included fellow inmates. During his incarceration, he gained the respect of both fellow prisoners and prison wardens who personally sought his counsel and ministry.


